When you think of fall and beer, the great German beer festival may spring to mind. Most of us have heard about it, but how many of you know what it is and how it originated?

Oktoberfest is a 16-18 day beer festival held annually in Munich, Germany, running from late September to the first weekend in October. It is one of the most famous events in Germany and is the world's largest fair, with more than 6 million people attending every year.

Crown Prince Ludwig, later to become King Ludwig I, was married to Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen on October 12th, 1810. The citizens of Munich were invited to attend the festivities held on the fields in front of the city gates to celebrate their marriage. The main draw to the festival was originally horse races, not beer.

Today, Munich's annual celebration is still held on the original site. Some modern changes are the giant brewery-sponsored beer halls that can hold up to 5,000 people apiece, they've moved the event ahead to September to allow for better weather conditions and horse races no longer take place.

Not planning a trip to Germany any time soon? In recent history Oktoberfest has made it's way to the US. There are locations across the nation where you can raise your stein and celebrate German heritage with music, food and beer!

The Cook's Corner

October means that summer has come to a close and fall has arrived. With fall comes the thought of Halloween and all that it implies: costumes, trick -or-treating, carved pumpkins, decorations, ghoulish spirits and many foods and fun.

In a flash back through history we find some interesting origins and traditions surrounding Halloween. Halloween comes from Samhain, which is a Celtic festival that can be traced back to the Roman festival of Pomona the goddess of fruit and seed. Samhain is harvest time and a time to take stock of food supplies and slaughter livestock for winter. Bonfires derived from the word bone-fire where discarded bones from the animals at feast would be lit and burned.

The harvest of the orchards and fields brought some age old traditions such as bobbing for apples and a variant where adults would retrieve an apple from a dangling string. Today, we have also included candy and caramel apples. Bonfire toffee is passed out in Britain and is rich with molasses and was thought to be medicinal in ancient times. Barmbrack, from Ireland, is a light fruit cake with a ring, coins and other charms placed into it before baking and whoever gets the ring is thought to find their true love. Originally people carved turnip instead of pumpkins, until the 1800s when people in North America used the inside meat of pumpkins to make pies, breads and roasted seeds.

Since the ancient times we have added a list of novelty candies and treats that make their way into children's bags as they trick-or-treating each year. So remember, Halloween is not just for the ghosts and goblins, but a feast for the senses and a confectionary adventure for everyone.
